A very important part of The Lyceum's offering is a well-attended and varied programme of engagement, outreach, youth theatre, and schools' projects delivered by our Creative Learning team.

The Royal Lyceum Theatre Edinburgh is delighted to announce a new casting opportunity for child performers for our festive show 2026 – “A Christmas Carol”.

The Lyceum Christmas show is an exciting annual event and the opportunity to be part of a professional company is a great chance to develop as a performer whilst also being part of a fun and supportive environment in one of the UK's leading producing theatres.

The Role

We are looking to cast three roles – Tiny Tim and his two siblings, Martha and Peter

Each role will be shared by 3 children, so there are a total of 9 opportunities.

All performers must be aged 9+ and must be based within a 40 minute travel time of The Lyceum Theatre.

Please note the show contains some content which could be upsetting, including death, poverty and some potentially frightening theatrical effects.

The show is rated age 7+ for the public.

It is important to note that this will be a busy performance schedule, with performances spread across morning (schools shows 10.15am – 12.15pm approx.), matinees (2pm – 4pm approx.) and evenings (7-9pm approx.).

Key dates/requirements

1. Rehearsals at the Lyceum Theatre in Edinburgh: weeks commencing 19th October, 26th October, 2nd November, 9th November, 16th November. For the first 4 weeks, we will endeavour to manage attendance outside of school hours e.g. evening/s and Saturdays.
2. Technical rehearsals onstage: w/c 23rd Nov – exact dates/times TBC. Some school absence may be required.
3. Performance dates 28th Nov 2026 – 3rd Jan 2027: 3 performers for each role who will perform on rotation. Performers will also be required to be on stand-by for other performances, meaning that they could be called at short notice to step in for a performance, should another of the child actors be ill or indisposed. Some school absence will be required.

Other criteria for who can audition

This is a professional acting job, working on a large-scale production alongside a large team of actors, creatives and technicians. Child actors will be supported by the stage management, producing and chaperone teams.

Who Can Audition

In order to audition, the child actor must:

- Be aged 9+ (for licensing purposes)
- Have prior acting experience (this does not need to be in a professional setting)
- Be able to hold a tune
- Be comfortable dancing
- Have a natural Scottish accent
- Live in Edinburgh or the immediate surrounding area. Due to the nature of the performance schedule, those who would have a journey to the theatre of more than 40 minutes cannot be considered.
- Be available during the key dates above – any non-availability must be flagged at application stage and will be taken into consideration
- Have a parent/guardian able to transport them to and from rehearsals and performances at The Royal Lyceum Theatre Edinburgh
- Some time out of school will be required, but we will keep this to a maximum of 5 days over the engagement in line with licencing regulations. We will apply for a child performance licence from your home local authority and will require cooperation and information from you and your school in order to complete this

Fees And Expenses

- £51.50 per rehearsal session
- £331.34 per week during performance weeks (to be confirmed once UK Theatre/Equity have released their rates for 2026/27)
- No other expenses will be paid.



Audition Process

- First round will be a group audition
- Recalls will be in smaller groups
- We will share information in advance about what to expect at the audition and any preparation required
- We will gather information about the child actor ahead of the audition, including any access needs

- Fri 12 June (5pm – 7.30pm)
- Sat 13 June (10am – 12.30pm)
- Sat 13 June (2pm-4.30pm)

About the roles

Tiny Tim (male)

Playing age 9

Actual age of performers 9-11 / Max height of performer approx. 134cms (4'4")

Tiny Tim is the son of Bob Cratchit, who works for Ebenezer Scrooge. Tim is poorly with an illness and has a bad cough. Despite his illness, Tim maintains a positive attitude and is well-loved by his family. He is the sibling to Martha and Peter.

The actor will also take on additional roles within the Ensemble as required.

Martha (female)

Playing age 10-12

Actual age of performers 11+ / Max height of performer approx. 148cms (4'9")

One of the Cratchit Children, sibling to Tiny Tim and Peter. Cheerful, hard-working and fun.

The actor will also take on additional roles within the Ensemble as required.

Peter (male)

Playing age 13-14

Actual age of performers 11+ / Max height of performer approx. around 158cms (5'2")

One of the Cratchit Children, sibling to Tiny Tim and Martha. Kind and supportive of their siblings and whole family.

Ideally unbroken voice.

The actor will also take on additional roles within the Ensemble as required.
