The Role

Jasmine is the daughter of Dex and Sylvie, who will be played by the actors below. Her parents are both English and Jasmine lives in London.

We are looking for an actor who is aged 9+, with a playing age of 9 years old Maximum height of 4 ft 10

This character appears in the second half of the play after the interval, towards the end of the show, so on evening shows it will be a late finish approx. 10/10:30pm

The show contains adult themes of loss.





Key dates/Requirements

- 1. Attendance during rehearsals in London on:
 - i.Friday 16th January (during week 2 of rehearsals)
 - ii.Friday 30th January 2026 (during week 4 of rehearsals)
- iii. This will include one or two overnight stays both of those weeks, and a parent/guardian will be required to travel down and stay with the child actor
- 2.Rehearsals in Edinburgh (week 6): w/c 9th Feb 2026 exact dates/times TBC. We will endeavour to manage attendance outside of school hours e.g. evening/s, Friday afternoon and Saturday
- 3. Tech rehearsals in Edinburgh: w/c 16th Feb and w/c 23rd Feb 2026 exact dates/times TBC
- 4.Performance dates 27th Feb 2026 19th April 2026: we are planning to cast 3 performers who will perform on rotation.

Who Can Audition

This is a professional acting job.

We will be casting three child actors in total to share the role of Jasmine on rotation.

In order to audition, the child actor must:

- Be aged 9+, and have a playing age of 9
- Maximum height of 4 ft 10
- Have prior acting experience in a professional theatre performance (singing and dancing not required)
- Be able to do an English accent
- Live in Edinburgh
- Be available during the key dates above, including the trips to London
- Parent/guardian able to transport the child to and from rehearsals and performances at The Royal Lyceum Theatre Edinburgh
- Some time out of school may be required but we will keep this to a maximum of 5 days over the engagement in line with licencing regulations
- We will apply for a child performance licence from your home local authority and will require cooperation and information from you and your school in order to complete this

Fees And Expenses

- £50 per rehearsal day payment
- £50 per show payment
- Accommodation, travel and per diem will be provided for attendance at the rehearsals in London
- No other expenses

Audition Process

First round: self-tape (see script and info below)

- Deadline 11pm on Sunday 26th October
- We aim to process by Weds 29th Oct and to send out invitations on Thursday 30th October to those we want to meet for an in-person audition

Second round:

- If the child actor is successful in the first round we will invite them to audition in person, which will take place on Tuesday 4th November at The Royal Lyceum Theatre in Edinburgh
- If this requires them to be out of school we will provide a letter for your Head Teacher to explain this
- We will share information about what to do and what to expect at the audition when we send the invitation

Self Tape Guidelines

DEXTER: What's your name, Mrs Elephant.

JASMINE: Emma.

DEXT: Your names Jasmine

JASMINE: Emma Elephant. And who are you?

DEX: Dexter Giraffe at your service.

DEXTER: Nice to meet you.

JASMINE: Did you know today is St Swithin's day?

DEX: I did.

JASMINE: Whatever happens today happens for forty days.

DEX: That's right.

JASMINE: What would you like to do today?

DEX: I would like to...

JASMINE: Go for a picnic.

DEXTER: Where would you like to go for a picnic Emma Elephant.

JASMINE: Arthur's Seat.
